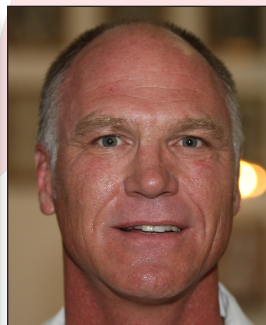

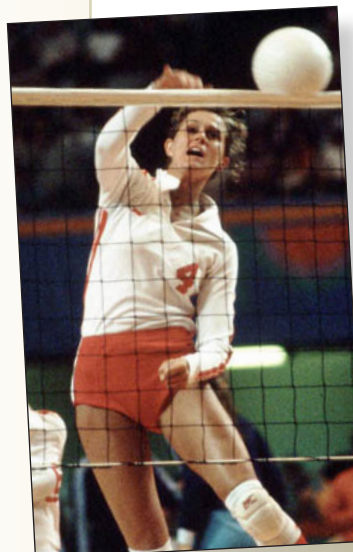

Don (Butch) Steponchev has been selected as referee supervisor for wheelchair basketball at the Paralympic Games this summer in Beijing.
